

YC Classes open for “busy, working adults”

Nighttime education at Sutter County One-Stop

Sutter County One-Stop, formerly known as CTEC, will offer evening classes for “busy, working adults” beginning Jan. 31.

Joe D’Andrea, director of the job service center, said Monday the six-week schedule in split into three separate “modules” and aimed at helping those who work during the day gain more skill and expertise for their current jobs.

“We got to thinking that a lot of people working during the day don’t want to commit to taking a long semester course at a college.” D’Andrea Said. “We wondered, “How can we make something to fit into busy schedules?”

The first module, which includes four sessions over a two –week period, will focus on Excel. It will run form 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. Tuesday and Thursdays until February 9.

Beginning February 14, a new module will begin called “Module Interface,” which is aimed at accounting and finance careers. It also will run from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays for two weeks at the Sutter County One-Stop.

February 28 will usher in the last of the series, “Financial statements and taxes: and run the same time and same days for two weeks. After the six-week sessions are completed, they will start over again, D’Andrea said.

“The whole point is to be flexible and try to meet the needs of people who working and have busy schedules,” he said. “Hopefully it will help them.:

D’Andrea said the Excel module is especially helpful because individuals who may be having trouble with a project at work can bring their documents with them and get help at the session.

“We’re trying to really break the mold a little in education, but with short, quick-hit courses for busy people,” he said.

Enrollment is open, which means participants may show up to any class, whether it is the first one or the third one, D’Andrea said.

To register for a single module, the cost is \$85, or to attend all three modules, the cost is \$215.
